




Tight outage windows driven by grid modernization and increased AI/data center loads.

TCP AVAILABILITY

QUICK TURN WHEN SCOPE PROVIDED



Basic Plans: Lead Time – 1–3 Days

For standard flagging or lane closures and low volume/residential areas (1–2 page plans)

Intermediate Plans: Lead Time – 3–5 Days

For multi lane closures, high volume areas, multi intersection sites, roundabouts, and projects affecting multiple transportation modes (3+ pages)

Complex Plans: Lead Time – 8–10 Days

For aerial line crossings, large detours with multiple intersections, and Interstate/DOT work (5+ page plans)
